Pharos Development Principles

- Does it expand access to products and mfrs
- Does it reward continuous product improvement
- Does it accommodate product innovation
- Does it drive the purchase of preferable products
- Does it empower purchasers to make more informed product decisions
- Does it reduce complexity and help lower costs for manufacturers and product purchasers
- Does it reduce the time and cost of bringing new products to market as compared to current testing and labeling methods
